SECTION 25.5 OPEN SPACE DISTRICT OR "OS" DISTRICT

- A. GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Open Space Zoning District is intended to protect significant or critical wildlife habitat areas or areas which should not be developed due to public health and safety reasons.
- B. USES PERMITTED NOT REQUIRING A USE PERMIT:

The following list is representative of Open Space uses, which are permitted on a parcel in the Open Space Zoning District:

- 1. Management of land and forest for the production and harvest of trees (including tree farming).
- 2. Habitat enhancement or improvement projects as approved by the Department of Fish and Game or other State or Federal Agency.
- 3. Pasture or grazing lands.
- 4. Other uses found to be similar in nature as determined by the Planning Commission.

C. USES REQUIRING A USE PERMIT:

- 1. Low intensity recreation uses, which require only minor improvements.
- 2. Mining activities.
- 3. Developing of public or private roads.
