Adult	<p><i>Adult is Overseen by Assistant Chief (Deputy Chief) Lance Floerke</i></p> <p>The Board of Supervisors recently signed a letter in opposition to AB 2882 (McCarty): Realignment CCP as requested for consideration by the Chief Probation Officer. As of May 24, the bill has passed the floor and continues to move through the process.</p>
Juvenile	<p><i>Juvenile is overseen by Deputy Chief Tim Dobbs</i></p> <p>The Board of Supervisors recently signed a letter in opposition to SB 1057 (Menjivar): JJCPA as requested for consideration by the Chief Probation Officer. As of May 24, the bill has passed the floor and continues to move through the process.</p> <p>In May, funded by the Sheriff’s Prop 64 Marijuana Grant, Deputy Probation Officer Lindley and Sheriff’s Deputy Halsey attended a three day National Student Safety Conference. National Student Safety & Security Conference: Building a Centralized Safety, Security & Emergency Preparedness Division; Leveraging Lessons Learned from Actual Events to Enhance Safety Planning. 2. Cybersecurity Schools and Colleges Summit: Analyzing the Ever-Changing Threat Landscape; Embracing Robust Security Best Practices. 3. Student Mental Health Congress: Promoting Positive Mental Health in Schools; Immersive Behavioral Therapy Workshop. 4. SRO Congress: Unveiling the Role of School Resource Officers; Mastering Threat Assessment for Enhanced Security. 5. America's School Bus Congress: Unpacking Best Practices for School Bus Safety; Guiding Response to Fatal School Bus/Van Incidents and Scene Expectations. <p>These sessions, complemented by over 50 breakout sessions and 16 immersive workshops, were tailored to equip attendees with valuable insights, practical strategies, and expert guidance.</p> <p>Local collaborative efforts for school safety continue to be made through school shooting trainings and drills. All Deputy Probation Officers assigned to juveniles spend time on school campuses to be present and respond to support positive behaviors and address negative behaviors.</p>
