Trinity County Coronavirus (COVID-19) Health Advisory

TRINITY COUNTY – On February 23, 2021, with the recent increase in case and test positivity rates, Trinity County has moved into the more restrictive Blueprint Red Tier. All sectors should refer to the Blueprint for a Safer Economy page on the COVID-19 state website for the guidance under the red tier at <https://covid19.ca.gov/safer-economy/>

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) conducts weekly assessment of county case and test positivity trends, if our adjusted case rate and/or test positivity rate falls within the more restrictive tier for two consecutive weekly periods, Trinity County must revert to the more restrictive tier. The following changes to sectors from orange to red tier go into effect Wednesday February 24, 2021 and include but are not limited to:

- Restaurants:
 - Indoor with modifications
 - Capacity must be limited to 25% or 100 people, whichever is less
- Wineries and tasting rooms:
 - Outdoor only
 - Capacity must be limited to 25% or 100 people, whichever is less
- Bars, breweries, and distilleries that do not serve meals:
 - Closed
- Retail:
 - Indoor operations, maximum capacity at 50%

- Hotels, Resorts, Lodging Entities
 - Open with modifications
 - Fitness centers can remain open at 10% capacity
 - Indoor pools, hot tubs, saunas, and steam rooms must close
 - Drowning prevention classes are permitted indoor and outdoor in all tiers as they are deemed essential

- Gyms and Fitness Centers
 - Indoor with modifications
 - Capacity must be limited to 10%
 - Indoor pools, hot tubs, saunas, and steam rooms must close
 - Drowning prevention classes are permitted indoor and outdoor in all tiers as they are deemed essential
 - Climbing walls open
